

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

# Speech at Beautiful Gate [CAC] Dedication - 3 March 2019

It is a joy to be at this joyous and auspicious occasion of the dedication of the Beautiful Gate Centre.

I bring greetings, best wishes and warmest congratulations of the Methodist Church in Malaysia Family to this celebration.

We are indeed most thankful to Almighty God for this ministry that has touched many lives. We have witnessed the progress and growth of the Beautiful Gate ministry, with its establishment of 8 such Centres.

We thank the many CAC churches, individuals, 17 NGOs (including Christian ones), companies and corporations who have given financial support as well as help rendered in various ways in making today's celebration possible.

1. The 1<sup>st</sup> reason why the Methodist Church in Malaysia carries out this Beautiful Gate Foundation Ministry is because of our **biblical roots**.

A. **Caring And Giving is rooted in God's very being.**

He is The God Of Compassion as seen in the Old Testament: An important image of God in the Bible is that of parent or father. God is Father. He is the responsible Creator who has a bond of love with His creation, especially humankind that is made after His own image. Our Father God especially cares for those in need: in the Old Testament world the most needy and vulnerable in society were the widows, orphans and aliens/migrants.

<sup>ESV</sup> **Proverbs 19:17** *Whoever is generous to the poor lends to the LORD, and he will repay him for his deed.*

<sup>NIV</sup> **Proverbs 19:17** *He who is kind to the poor lends to the LORD, and he will reward him for what he has done.*

When we carry out good deeds especially to the needy and the poor – we become salt and light for God in touching, transforming, bringing needed help and awaited healing for those in need.

B. **He is the GOD of healing in the New Testament:**

The New Testament continues this same active theme as it is filled with the explicit demonstrated life of compassion of the Lord Jesus Christ as He met the needs of body, mind and spirit of the people around Him. The needs of body, mind and spirit of the people around us have not changed. We witness the countless cases of how the Lord Jesus healed the scarred bodies of **lepers**, gave sight to the blind eyes of **Bartimeus**, freed **Mary Magdalene** from 7 evil spirits, delivered the guilty conscience of a

rich tax collector like **Zacchaeus**, as He told them that the power of the Kingdom of GOD/ Heaven was upon them. We, the Church, follow in the footsteps of our Beloved Saviour and Master in fulfilling the mission He came to fulfil: <sup>NLT</sup> **Luke 4:17** *The scroll of Isaiah the prophet was handed to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where this was written: <sup>18</sup> "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, for he has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim that captives will be released, that the blind will see, that the oppressed will be set free, <sup>19</sup> and that the time of the Lord's favor has come."*

2. The second reason why the Methodist Church in Malaysia does this is because of our **historical roots**. The Methodist Church was founded by Rev John Wesley [1703-1791]. John Wesley in 18<sup>th</sup> Century England was well known for His outspoken resistance to the slave trade, **alcohol traffic, excessive interests charged to the poor**. He undertook advocacy for the **poor in education**. He started and superintended **schools and orphanages**, supported **women** preachers and their rights, and helped to relieve the sick. He also pioneered the **electric shock** treatment for the mentally ill, dealt with **alcohol abuse** severely, advocated **prison reform**, was involved in the **abolition of slavery**; and administered aid **charities**. John Wesley wrote one of the all-time bestselling medical texts titled **Primitive Physick** that went through 32 editions, making it one of the most widely read books in England. Because of his charitable nature he died poor, having lived by his own convictions: **'Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the places you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can, as long as ever you can.'** The second is **-"Earn all you can, give all you can, save all you can"**.

3. We are glad that **today**, in the Methodist Church in Malaysia – **our caring and giving continues to be rooted in God's very being** as the God of compassion, and founded on the great historical heritage of the Methodist Church left to us by God's servant John Wesley. Today, our Methodist Churches in Malaysia, amongst many of our social outreach work are Prison Ministry, Homes and Caring for the elderly, Orphanages and Homes and tui-

tion centres for poor children especially in Sibu, Bintulu, KK, Drug Rehabilitation Centre, Health Clinic Sessions, free legal clinics, 69 Mission Schools, 2 Private Colleges and 6 private schools, operating Dialysis Centres, our Methodist Education Foundation [with text exemption status] gave grants to 128 students amounting to RM 375,275 in 2018. We thank the Lord for the Ministry Of Beautiful Gate – that continues to minister in the healing name of Jesus Christ.

4. We continue to minister in this wonderful name that **provides** blessings. He supplies our needs to **facilitate** this ministry and gives us the **success** of our labour. In the words of King Solomon, the wise king who is attributed to writing only 2 Psalms, Ps 127 and Ps 72. <sup>ESV</sup> **Psalm 127:1** a song of ascents of solomon. “Unless the LORD builds the house, those who build it labor in vain. Unless the LORD watches over the city, the watchman stays awake in vain.” His father King David, a very able soldier, talented musician, a man of valour and bravery, full of charisma/ magnetism/ appeal and surrounded by deeply loyal and very skilled soldiers/ warriors – said the same thing in another way in Ps 124. <sup>NLT</sup> **Psalm 124:1** “What if the LORD had not been on our side?” Let all Israel repeat: *We thank the lord – he is on our side because we have chosen to be on his side* – even as this ministry of Beautiful Gate is inspired by Jesus Christ of Nazareth and submitted to the Lordship and leading of the Holy Spirit:
5. Let me close with the words of John Wesley: **“But if God be for you, who can be against you? Are all of them together stronger than God? O be not weary of well doing!”** — John Wesley

And so today as we dedicate this building and ministry of the Beautiful Gate Foundation, we dedicate ourselves to “Be Not Weary Of Well Doing”! AMEN.



# 印度赈灾事工

报道：吴姮霖

7月十多天的连绵大雨，致使印度南部喀拉拉邦（Kerala）8月面临严重的洪灾：超过四百八十人死亡，近百万人被疏散和安置在疏散中心里。喀邦十四个县全处于危险的警戒状态。印度卫理使徒教会（Methodist Apostolic Church of India，简称MACI）的摩西牧师（Rev. Moses）便联系年会卫理救援赈灾事工（Methodist Crisis Relief & Development，简称MCRD）来援助灾民。

MCRD立即展开招募志愿者和义卖月饼的活动。感恩，有志愿者积极回应，我们得以组成四人团队：由日落洞堂主理——詹廷波牧师担任队长，带领郭贤成弟兄、胡俊洋弟兄和卫理赈灾委员会（跨部）干事——吴姮霖姐妹到灾区。我们9月2日出发，8日回国；主要行程是评估印度灾区和将MCRD筹得的款项帮助灾民。

2日晚上十一时三十分（印度时间），我们抵达机场，当地四位牧者来柯钦国际机场接我们。翌日，我们开会讨论后，按摩西牧师安排的行程，到灾区评估灾情和为灾户登记名字。前往灾区途中，已不见洪水漫过的痕迹，相信政府在我们抵达前已迅速清理。然而，灾后受损、受毁的现象是显而易见的。我们回酒店开会，经双方讨论后，我们将分配食品和生活基本用品给登记的家庭。

第三天，我们花了约三个小时的路程，从喀拉拉邦到泰米尔纳德邦购买物品。受洪灾影响，我们无法在当地购买大量食品和基本用品。第四和五天，我们在印度卫理使徒教会包装救济品；下午就派发给有登记的家庭，一切都非常顺利。MCRD的宗旨是不分种族、宗教与国籍，援助灾民。我们在三个地区，即Vettukadavu Chalakudy（五十二户，有九户是穆斯林家庭）、Kodassery Thalur（九十三户）和Vellanchira Centre（六十六户）派发救济品，共有两百一十一户家庭获得约七十五令吉的救济品。

从这次救援赈灾的回应中，我学到凡事要随机应变，要以感恩的心去面对和接受每个突发状况。第一晚入住印度酒店时，我住三楼，其他队员住二楼。即使害怕，但我为可以入住酒店而感谢神。我对印度这国家有了更多的认识，因亲自体验当地人的生活作息、饮食习惯和文化。我也有机会离开舒适窝，以谦卑之心服侍、援助陌生人和关怀他们渡过这艰难时刻。虽然给予的并不多，仍盼望这一点点的付出，能成为他们的祝福和鼓励他们继续积极生活。希望他们使用我们所给的救济品时，能体会上帝和来自马来西亚弟兄姐妹的爱心！

救灾是实际付出和给予的行动，就像主耶稣在<马太福音>25章40节所言：“这些事你们既作在我这弟兄一个最小的身上，就是作在我身上了。”

# United in Vision, Advancing Christ



Kuching – Rev. Dr. Khoo Ho Peng launched the Sarawak State Council, The Boys’ Brigade In Malaysia, inaugural theme during the 2019 AGM at Blessed Sacrament Church from March 1-2.

The newly drawn up biennial theme, ‘United in Vision, Advancing Christ’, was approved by the State Executive Committee last year. It is guided by the Bible verse taken from Romans 15:6 (so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ).

Rev. Dr. Khoo, who is also the State Chaplain, in his exhortation, emphasized on the importance of having a theme as it helps to focus on vision. “When you are in the Boys’ Brigade long enough, you may tend to forget your objective/goals. It takes years to internalize your sense of purpose. Any Christian organization will face the common danger of turning into a social club,” he cautioned.

Using John 17:11, 20-23, he stressed that unity matters to God, and unity is not uniformity. “Be united in BB’s vision and seek to be faithful in your respective mission field. Without unity, we will not go far. Any organization will disintegrate without unity.”

He further explained by analogy: “Imagine BB as a ship. Though there are many rooms and compartments (opinions) but ultimately, it’s the ship deck (God’s Kingdom) that forms the permanent covering. We come from diverse backgrounds. We must preserve unity since we are called to service.”

Continuing his exhortation, Rev. Dr. Khoo underscored three key essentials; Leaders must sincerely care for each other, BB’s good relationship with the Sponsoring Church, Leaders who truly serve Christ.

Rev. Dr. Khoo also encouraged the BB Officers to seize the moment and open more harvest fields specifically to the indigenous youth in the rural and urban areas.

In conclusion, Rev. Dr. Khoo reminded the Officers of the power and promise of the Holy Spirit (John 14:15-17, Acts 1:8). “In our ministry, you are the spiritual leaders and you will need The Holy Spirit to advance God’s Kingdom.”

# Gereja Methodist Iban Miri



## History

- Formed in 1984 to cater for Non English speaking members.
- Originally started with 10 – 15 Families and now there are around 100 families.
- Prior to using the newly completed Church at Lutong, Miri, worship services were carried out in homes, Police Field Camp and Shop Lot allocated by SCAC Life Methodist church.

## Background of church members

- About 80% of the members are those employed in offshore oil and gas companies, construction industries and those doing odd jobs.
- They reside around Tudan, Kampung Pasir, Sea-line, Kampung Api-Api, Pujut, Kerbau, Pujut Corner within the vicinity of the newly completed Church.
- Members are mainly from Sibu, Kapit, Sarikei, and Bintangor Divisions looking for job opportunities in Miri.

## Current Activities of the Church

- Sunday Worship Services every Sunday.
- Sunday School along with Sunday Worship Service.
- Monthly Bible Study.
- Evangelism around Miri include visits to the hospital and to old age members homes, especially those who are not able to attend Sunday Services.
- Methodist Women Fellowship activities on a weekly basis.
- Youth weekly development program include praise and worship, music, etc.
- Organise Divisional Youth Camp periodically.
- Organise seminars and workshops.

## The New Church

- The one acre piece of land was allocated by the State Go-

vernment on 27.10.2010. It is located near Lutong.

- The Plan is to build;
  - (1) a Church building with a main hall for worship services. It will also include pastors' offices, prayer room, meeting room and 4 rooms for Sunday school and;
  - (2) A pastor's residence, an annex to the main building.
- Construction works commenced on 08th August, 2015 after obtaining necessary approvals for the building plans.
- Church building was completed in September 2018 with bit of work remaining to be completed.
- Dedication service was carried out by our Bishop Dr. Ong Hwai Teik on 16 Feb 2019.
- The pastor's residence will be built upon securing sufficient funds.
- Remaining works include fixtures and furniture for Sunday School classrooms, Prayer room and Meeting room and tiling work on the first floor.
- Total construction cost @ 31.1.19 - RM 1,804,952
- Total Funds collected @ 31.1.19 – RM 1,585,420
- Total Debt = RM 219,532.00
- Estimated cost of remaining works.
  - (i) Pastor's residence – RM 300,000.
  - (ii) Fixtures and furniture for class rooms for Sunday school, meeting rooms, prayer room and tiling of first floor – RM 50,000.

# Disciple – Under the Tree of Life

After some years of waiting, my wife Roseline and I finally got to join the Yellow Book Disciple Course after having completed the Red, Purple, and Green Books.

This year, DISCIPLE - Under The Tree of Life (Yellow Book) is facilitated by Pastor Linberg Wong of Agape Grace Methodist Church. In total, 13 participants enrolled.

To study this Book, one needs to have at least completed DISCIPLE: Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study (Red Book).

One is expected in terms of time and discipline, to invest 30 to 45 minutes of daily reading and note-taking, to reflect and pray 6 days a week, and participate in a two-and-a-half-hour weekly group study for 32 weeks.

Bishop Richard B. Wilke, who created The DISCIPLE Bible Study Series, has always said that the Disciple Study is not for information but for Transformation.

“A loving family is worth more than the whole wealth in the world. And we ought to learn from the Book of Ruth how we should take our family seriously and apply loyalty and loving-kindness,” commented participant Robert Ting, a Small Group Leader and Chairman of Agape Grace Methodist Church.

“Often family cohesiveness is not easy to maintain; what more about connections with our extended family? Effort and sacrifices need to be made,” my wife expressed.

“I pray you all will be disciplined and stay faithful to complete the course,” encouraged Pastor Linberg. “Remember to do your daily reading and do not try to rush everything,” added the good



shepherd.

A simple celebratory dinner was held in my home last evening before we commenced our first lesson.

# DEVOTION

## Intentional Rest

Faith is reason at rest in God.

(Charles Spurgeon)

**IN WORD:** On the surface, the grace life should be easy. All that's required is belief in God's mercy, His power to save, and His ability to sustain. But in fact the grace life is difficult, not because of the effort required, but because of our tendency to default back to what we can do for ourselves. We must intentionally set our minds to live by faith.

The Galatians, for example, had problems balancing grace and works, and they had lapsed back into their traditional form of legalism. They knew they had been accepted by God in His mercy, but forgot that mercy was to sustain them daily. They tried to live their life in the Spirit by the strength of their flesh. That's not God's plan.

We do that too. We well understand that the blood of Jesus was spilled as payment for our sin, a holy sacrifice for an unholy race. We also understand that obedience is required of us. But when it comes to relating to God daily, we neglect our

dependence on grace and revert to the self-reliance of our best performance. All of our obedience may be good and pleasing to Him, but only as an outcome of our dependence on His mercy, never as a means to earn it. His grace put us in good standing with Him; our good deeds are to be done out of love.

**IN DEED:** Regardless of how long you've been a Christian, your human nature will tempt you to revert to works. Saved by grace, you'll be tempted to live by your ability to be righteous by your own efforts. You'll do all sorts of gymnastics to get God's approval and keep it—unless, that is, you remind yourself frequently that Jesus won His approval and invited you into it by faith.

If you're burdened by the Christian life, remember that just as God has given you grace for salvation, He will give you grace for obedience through faith. Live in dependence on God—for everything—and rest. The grace walk is relaxing when we learn it. Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:2), and be at peace.


Prayer:


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
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
